Keynote works with Mac OS X version 10.2 or later, and a minimum of 128 MB of RAM, 8 MB of video memory (VRAM) and 1 GB of available disk space.



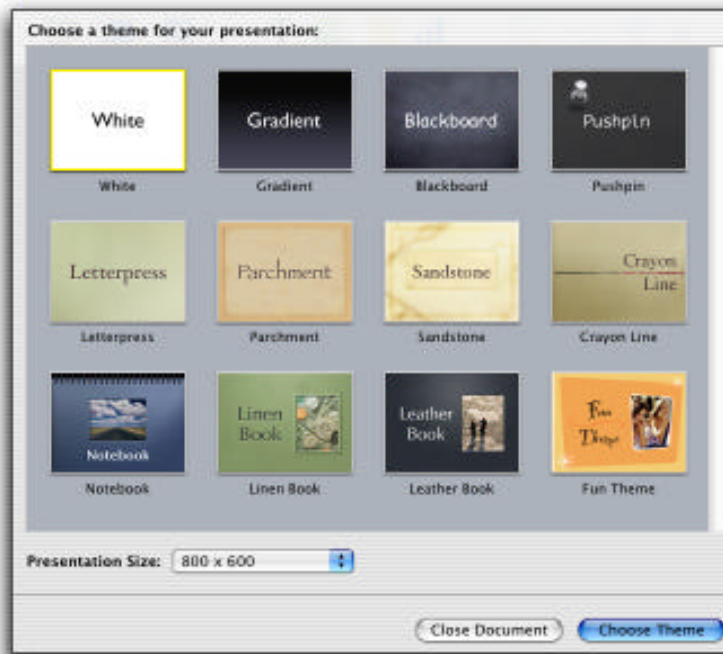
Tip!

You can open a PowerPoint or Appleworks presentation in Keynote by dragging its icon over the Keynote icon.



Tip!

Choose 800 by 600 resolution and click retain changes to theme defaults for your first presentation.



Start your Presentation

1. Open **Keynote**.
2. If you already created a presentation and want to continue working on it, go to **File** to **Open** and find the file.
3. Select one of the themes.
4. Click **Choose Theme**.

Choose Navigator View

1. Click **View** on the toolbar.
2. Select **Navigator**.
3. This gives you the slide view and thumbnails along the left side of the slide.
