Microsoft FrontPage is an application for creating web sites. By the time you have finished this guide, you will be able to create a site with multiple pages, including text, graphics, tables, backgrounds, borders, and links. You will also learn the steps for publishing your web site.



Reference!

A **web** is a site comprised of one or more **pages**, like a folder containing many documents.

Choosing one of the wizards or templates provided can help you get your web started faster by providing pre-designed pages for common purposes.

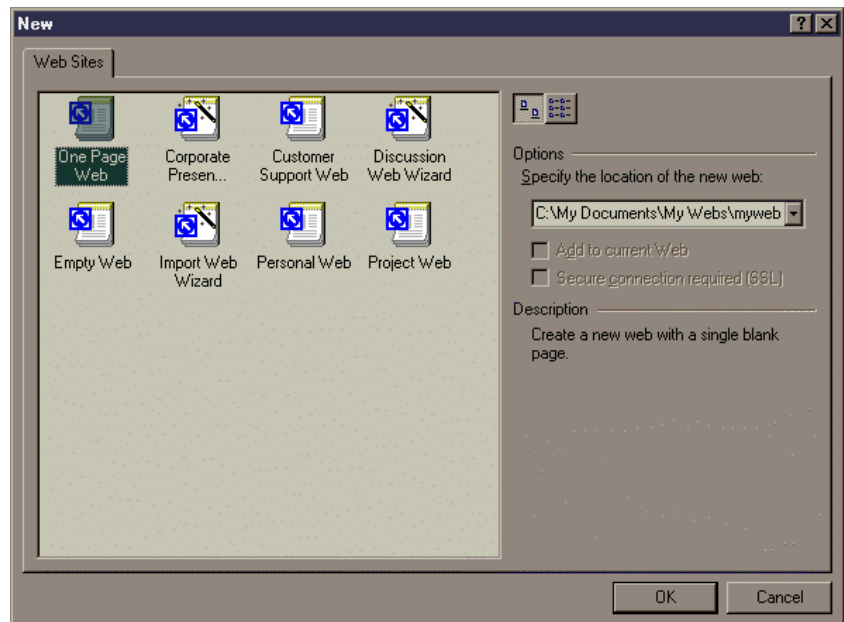

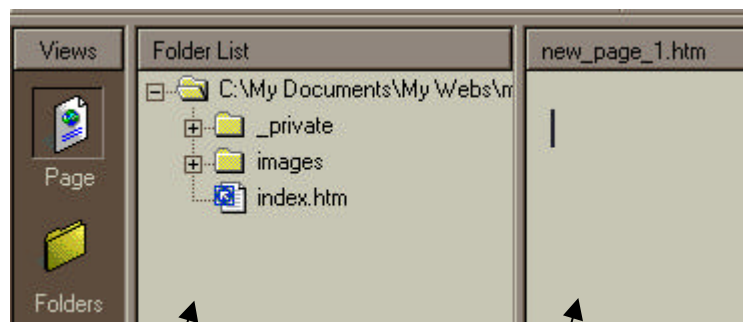
FrontPage will automatically create a page called **index.htm**, which will appear in the Folder List. This page is used as the home page for the web and will be the first page viewers see when they type in the web address.

Get Started With FrontPage

1. Open Microsoft FrontPage.
2. Go to the **File** menu, to *New*, then to *Web*.
3. Accept the default, One Page Web.



4. Click **OK**. A new web and a new page will be created. A Folder List will also appear to display the folders and pages in your web.
